



A hate crime is

an offense where a person or a group of people are targeted because of their identity...actual or perceived. A hate incident is conduct by an individual or group that, while motivated by hate or bias, does not rise to the level of a criminal offense.

Illinois hate crimes laws

protect people who are targeted based on race, color, creed, religion, ancestry, gender, sexual orientation, physical or mental disability, citizenship, immigration status, or national origin of another individual or group of individuals.

There are many ways we can call out hate...

911 or Local Police

Call **9-1-1** immediately if you fear for your safety or the safety of others. File a police report with local law enforcement, citing a hate crime or hate incident.
